Description of Event: Walk a Mile in Her Shoes is an event held by multiple campus's, organizations, communities, etc., on the basis of an international men's march to stop rape, sexual assault, and gender violence. The event is focused upon stopping sexual

assault and raising awareness for RISE (Rape Intervention Services and Education). With the idea stemming from a gentleman of Youngstown State University, this individual (who has now passed away) was focused on bringing the community together and raising awareness for this cause. Last year, the Inter-Fraternity Council at Youngstown State University did just that with the first annual Walk a Mile in Her Shoes event that was held last year at the Watson and Tressel Training Site. Multiple fraternity members came on an early Saturday morning. There were 34 members from the 5 greek fraternity chapters on YSU's campus. With the help of the YWCA and sorority members from the 4 chapters on YSU's campus, there was an a nice turnout for the event. Women spoke from the YWCA, the Greek Life Advisor (Carrie Anderson) spoke, and the event director (Stephen Daprile) also had some words. After that, the men strapped up in the red women's high heels and walked a mile on the track inside the WATTS center. There were raffle baskets, T-Shirts and other items being raffles off. Even with all of that success, we are looking to make this year much bigger and much better. We are planning on outreaching to other organizations as well. We have another fraternity on campus that will participate, more fraternity members will be joining in the walk from each chapter, Fire departments and police departments are interested in walking the mile and other organizations on campus. There will be a significant increase amongst the amount of people that are joining in on the cause so we must have everything set up to make it as memorable and better than last year. For this, we will need more high heels and more T-shirts to give out for each participant. Since we are starting off our marketing an extra month before the event will happen (as compared to last year), we will be much farther along and much more prepared. We will make this event as big as possible and will continue on for years, so hopefully with the help of the SGA, we can do just that.

How will this event benefit YSU and the student body This event will raise awareness for Rape and Sexual Assault in the community and on campus's. Often, raising awareness is over looked and is taken for granted. However, if people will just take 2 hours of one day of the year to come out and show support, it will mean that much more to the 683,000 women that are raped each year. That number is too large to not be addressed and with our support and the support of the area, maybe our assitance will bring that number down. This profit from this event will also go towards RISE (Rape intervention Services & Education) to help fund their efforts so more women can seek outreach. Everyone will have a chance to participate in the event whether that is doing the walk, raising funds or just coming out to support your favorite walker or organization. Events like this, are what get people in the community talking and will help with putting Youngstown, Ohio and Youngstown State University back on the map.

Fundraising: We have fundraised for this event before and everything went smoothly. There are also events that we have raised for in our respective chapters. Personally, for my chapter (Alpha Phi Delta Fraternity), which there are three members on the Interfraternity Council from this chapter. We have done Vision Week and Ms. Alpha Phine (formerly known as Miss Alpha Fine) and raised \$800 which went directly to the Cornea Research Foundation of America. We also do a Spaghetti Dinner every year and this year we raised a little over \$3,000.

Description of Event: This event is being hosted by the outreach project, PAYO: Poverty Awareness in Youngstown. This is an honors-led event within the honors college. This is PAYO's third active year in the community and they have expanded from helping 150 Youngstown residents in their first year to 500 in their second. This year they are expecting to impact 700 to 1000 resident directly with their carnival, and up to 4000 indirectly through their donations of books and dental hygiene products. The Trustees are asking for an appropriation so that we can assist PAYO in their efforts to better the community. PAYO is opening up hosting carnival booths to all YSU students and student organizations. The Trustees would like to sponsor the creation of booths by our honors students so that they do not have to worry about the out of pocket expense of purchasing materials. For example, we have one group of freshmen honors students who would like

to host a dunk tank booth. This will cost approximately 200 and PAYO does not have these funds nor do the students. Through SGA assisting us through an appropriation, the trustees will be able to sponsor more individuals who would like to set up booths. Further, books can be purchased from the Poland Library at .25, .50 and 1.00. Trustees would like to further help PAYO through giving them book donation through purchasing these affordable books at the Poland Library. Because PAYO's focus is on receiving donations for books and dental hygiene products, we would like to assist them with any monetary costs that come up.

How will this event benefit YSU and the student body This event benefits the entirety of Youngstown. The carnival is a fun way to engage our local Youngstown students and it is also the perfect location to give away much needed donations of books and dental hygiene products. Further, it is the perfect opportunity for YSU student organizations to get engaged in the Youngstown community and create a booth pertaining to their interests and share it with local children. For example, the American Chemistry Society has already signed up to host a mini chemistry show as their booth. They did this at last year's carnival as well.
